- Evidence of Intermediate Level English – IELTS (Academic) 6.0 or equivalent
- Personal statement of purpose for studying at Bedford College

ENROLMENT FEE:

In order to secure your place in the course, a non-refundable Enrolment Fee of \$300 is payable. This fee is additional to the course costs outlined above.

COURSE TIMETABLES

Business & Leadership and Management

- Attend College 3 days per week.
- Undertake 35 hours (one week) work placement in week 30.

Early Childhood Education and Care

Certificate in Early Childhood Education and Care

- Attend College 3 days per week.
- Minimum mandatory work placement of 160 hours applies to this course.

Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care

- Attend College 3 days per week.
- Minimum mandatory work placement of 280 hours applies to this course.

Work Placement for both Certificate and Diploma courses

- Work placement will be undertaken in a registered early childhood education and care service in Australia.
- Students will need to work with the 0-2 years age group and also the 3-5 years age group.
- Work placement is planned as two block placements falling in June and November. Whilst on work placement, students will attend 8 hour days.
- Students must complete all class-based assessment tasks at a satisfactory level to be deemed ready for work placement.

Note: A current Working with Children Check (WWCC) is compulsory before students can begin work placement.

Individual Support and Ageing Support

- Attend College 3 days per week.
- Minimum mandatory work placement of 120 hours applies to this course. Practicum starts from Term 2 onwards.

Note: A Police Check, NDIS Worker Check and proof of COVID-19 vaccinations are prerequisites for undertaking work placement.

Community Services

- Attend College 3 days per week.
- Minimum mandatory work placement of 200 hours applies to this course. Practicum starts from Term 2 onwards.

Note: A Working with Children Check (WWCC), NDIS Worker Check and Police Check are prerequisites for undertaking work placement.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Student Support

At Bedford College, we aim to provide a warm, friendly environment for students. Most students find that they make friends very quickly and get support from teachers, admin staff and other students. However, some students may require additional assistance, which is available through our Learning Support coordinator. In addition, we offer English support for those international students who may need further clarification or explanation of work or assignments.

Academic Counselling

Bedford College will make every effort to assist students who require help in the learning process. Advice on academic issues can be provided by individual teachers and the Dean of Faculty.

Personal Counselling
